Education at the Eureka Rescue Mission

The Eureka Rescue Mission is dedicated to educating people concerning the Bible, "life skills", people skills, work ethics, job skills and literacy. Learning these truths and skills and making application in the way we are living is our final goal. We believe that the Bible is the only true, unchanging standard by which we can determine our purpose, our spiritual condition and experience a new abundant life.

In our Men's New Life Discipleship Program we provide men with intensive Bible training five days a week. If someone is struggling with literacy related issues, we are prepared and overloved to provide literacy training for them in-house by our trained staff. By the time a man graduates from the program, he has accomplished approximately 600 hours of theological studies. Along with those Bible studies, which are provided by local pastors, teachers and Mission staff, we have also implemented life restoration classes such as the "One Step" study. This study is designed as a biblical approach to addiction studies, and not only does it deal with substance abuse issues, but is also designed to help men deal with ANY addiction biblically and permanently.

The structure for the New Life Program is a dormitory set

-ting. Men live 4 to a room, eat meals together in the cafeteria, work and study together. As you can imagine, this creates a natural environment to learning people-skills and problem solving. This environment creates situations for communication, listening, forgiving and friendship. It also keeps our house managers and pastors busy!

We also provide men and women staying at the Mission the opportunity to develop a work ethic and job skills by performing important tasks around the Mission including working in the kitchen, janitorial tasks, serving during evening chapel services, and laundry. They also volunteer throughout the community, at our Free Store, and also at our Thrift Store. Even though the New Life Discipleship Program is not a work based program, we feel it is part of the education process to ensure that they have been provided training in job skills and been shown a work ethic.

What we endeavor to accomplish here at the Mission is teaching how the Bible can be put into practice and applied in our everyday lives. Hopefully, as men and women rejoin society, they will have been better equipped with skills that are necessary to be an asset within our community.



The men on the New Life Discipleship Program, who once lived under these strongholds, had the opportunity to give back to the community by cleaning up several illegal campsites along the road below the Humboldt County Library. The place was a mess! Mattresses, wet blankets and clothing, cans, bottles, drug paraphernalia, and various other articles were removed. Two 20 yard dumpsters were filled in all.



During the cleanup our men were reminded of what the Lord has brought them out of and what they have to look forward to if they turn from Him.
