

employment. First impressions are critical to landing a job and being able to help our guests reach this important goal is accomplished with the help of thoughtful people in our community who donate their gently used and sometimes new clothing to our Thrift Store. We have a constant flow of quality clothing from our Thrift Store to stock our clothing rooms at the Shelters which ensures that guests who are searching for employment will look presentable to potential employers. Access to our clothing room and shower facilities throughout the week on unscheduled clothing and shower days is also offered. We provide storage lockers for our job seeking guests to store their backpacks and other personal items for the day in order to alleviate the burden of packing them around. In addition, extended housing privileges are given until the working guest can move into permanent housing. By meeting these basic needs, much of the stress that comes with being homeless is alleviated, enabling our guests to concentrate on finding and keeping that all important job. One excellent example of this is Lawrence Glockner. Lawrence has a job and is now looking into finding permanent housing. It is such a blessing to see individuals who, at one time, had no hope of ever finding their way out of being unemployed and homeless, into confidently employed men who are excited about moving into a place that they can call home. This brings

We would like to introduce Kailee and Aiden; we have been blessed to have them here with us at our Women and Children's Shelter. Kailee felt she wanted to share about her experience with us. Kailee began telling us her story, "Well before me and my son showed up in Humboldt we were living in Long Beach with my sons dad. We

were panhandling every day for a roof over Aiden's head. It wasn't working for us in Long Beach so we decided to move up here to get on our feet. Coming to Humboldt with nothing, my son and I came to the Rescue Mission. I am so thankful for this place. They helped me get on my feet and made me feel better about the situation we were facing. My son loves all the staff and I can say we are just glad to be here. Since moving up here I have acquired a job, made arrangements for proper child care and I'm attending classes to improve my job skills, only because of the Mission's help. I feel like I've improved since staying here, living at the Mission has made my faith, relationships and life a lot stronger." All of staff at the Women and Children's Shelter are grateful to have had this opportunity to be part of this journey with Kailee and her son Aiden.

year long, New Life Discipleship program. Vaughn was ready for a life change and agreed to commit to the year at the program. Through his time at the program, Vaughn immersed himself in his studies and made himself available for any chores that needed to be done. "It was not easy", said Vaughn, "but if you put your heart and mind into it, you can do anything". After completing the program, Vaughn had his heart set on moving back to San Francisco where his family was located. Unfortunately he was still on parole (for a total of three years) when he graduated and was unable to move, so he found a job with a local contractor

and settled in. Vaughn eventually moved into his own apartment in Eureka and continued attending church along with midweek Bible studies. The New Life Program gave Vaughn a new outlook on life. He is now a man of God, a man of integrity and tackles life with the determination to overcome whatever trials come his way. Vaughn said, "You have to surround yourself with likeminded people in order to succeed." As soon as Vaughn completed parole he

moved to San Francisco close to his friends and loved ones. Currently, Vaughn is trying to rekindle his relationship with his family, especially his kids, whom he has missed very much. Vaughn said he hadn't seen or been with his family for a long time, so he was still getting used to the fact that family was essentially right next door to him. Now working for the Carpenters Union, Vaughn says his life has never been so different, he is now disciplined in everything he does, especially in saving money. He attends church on a regular basis, and is still on the straight and narrow path that God has laid before him. During his free time he enjoys fishing, camping and, playing billiards, but most of all he loves



being outdoors. Periodically, Vaughn makes his way back to Eureka to visit friends and the New Life Program men, encouraging them to complete the program, to strive for that relationship with God, and to stay on track in everything they do. Vaughn summarized everything he had been through by saying "God is looking at me, helping me out, and as long as I keep searching and standing on solid ground, I will succeed in anything I do."
