

Do you remember Lisa and Noah from a previous newsletter? Well, take a look at where they are now! In April 2022, Lisa and Noah relocated to Eureka, California. Just 14 months later, Lisa has achieved numerous personal goals that she had set for herself when they arrived at the Women and Children's Shelter. Leaving behind over a decade of addiction and homelessness, Lisa made the courageous decision to move across the country with her two-year-old son, Noah. From the moment they arrived at the shelter, Lisa felt the presence of Jesus with a sense of open arms and love.

Living with Type 1 Diabetes, Lisa faced significant health challenges and weighed only 75 pounds upon arrival. She had experienced several close calls with death, having been hospitalized three times before making the move. However, since coming to the shelter, Lisa has received the necessary medical attention and proper nutrition to effectively manage her condition. Celebrating 14 months of sobriety, she has regained her health and found happiness. Lisa secured employment with In-Home Supportive Services, providing much-needed assistance to individuals in their homes. Additionally, until April 15, 2023, she

served as a volunteer assistant at the Women and Children's Shelter, before officially transitioning into a part-time house manager role. Lisa's contribution to our team has been remarkable, as she shares the Gospel, hope, faith, love, and her own life experiences with shelter

arms and Love" With great determination and resourcefulness, Lisa obtained her California Driver's License and purchased a vehicle to commute to work and transport Noah to preschool. On May 20, 2023, she signed a lease for a onebedroom apartment in Eureka, fully furnishing the unit with the savings she accumulated during her stay at the shelter. Lisa has learned valuable money management skills, embraced structure, paid off past debts, and has been a devoted mother since arriving at the shelter. Reflecting on her journey, Lisa expressed her deep gratitude, stating, "Without the foundation and stability provided by the Mission during my darkest hour, I know I would not have survived. I am so appreciative of what this place and its supporters have done for our lives. I never imagined such a place existed. I am eternally blessed for the opportunities and love we have received at the Mission." Looking ahead, Lisa plans to continue living her best life within our community, giving back and sharing the Gospel and the love of Christ with those around her. We are grateful for her unwavering dedication and commitment to making a difference in the lives of others, one life at a time.

Kelli



Kelli Dore was born in 1964 in Mission Hills, California, into a tumultuous home marked by abuse and alcoholic parents. Early on, her parents separated, and she found herself living with a stepfather who subjected her to further mistreatment. Unable to endure the abuse, Kelli frequently ran away, only to return to an unchanged environment, prompting her to run again and ultimately leading to her homelessness. Feeling lost and unsure of her next steps, Kelli reached out to a friend in Redding who was in recovery. He extended a helping hand, offering her a place to stay, and over time, they got married. Together, they raised two sons, sharing 21 years of their lives. However, Kelli spent the last decade of their marriage trapped in active addiction, while her husband remained sober. Recognizing that her husband deserved better, Kelli made the difficult decision to leave the marriage. In the divorce, she was granted ownership of the house but, due to her addiction and insufficient income, she eventually lost it. Despite the separa-

tion, Kelli and her ex-husband maintain a distant friendship, continuing to communicate to this day. Finding herself back on the streets, Kelli sought help from a local substance abuse program. After successfully completing a 90-day program, she graduated, but permanent housing remained elusive. This led her to the Women and Children's Shelter, where she diligently saved her income as required, preparing for future housing. Through the assistance of a local property management company, Kelli managed to secure a private room in the heart of Old Town but tragically, just days before signing her lease, Kelli broke her hip while jumping over a rain puddle. Undeterred, she signed the lease from her hospital bed before embarking on inpatient physical rehabilitation. Following her release, Kelli returned to the shelter for a few days of rest before finally moving

into her new unit. With resilience and determination, she was able to not only fully furnish her new space, but also was able to settle her past debts. Reflecting on her journey, Kelli acknowledges that the Mission provided exactly what her soul needed. The love and support she received, along with the nightly Chapel Services, played a significant role in restoring her strained relationship with Christ. Today, her faith and walk with Je-

sus are healthy and strong, and she cherishes the meaningful connections she made along the way. Kelli remains connected to the Mission and frequently returns to visit and have a meal with all of us. When asked what she would say to the supporters of this Ministry, she expressed her profound gratitude, saying, "I love you all, and thank you for loving all of us. You have helped me more than you will ever know."

After experiencing a devastating house fire in West Virginia, Erin Sepeda found himself without a place to turn and completely empty of any faith in himself. The weight of life's challenges, including a bitter divorce, the house fire, and a persistent struggle with drug and alcohol addiction, seemed undefeatable. Determined to leave West Virginia, Erin boarded a bus and embarked on a journey across the country, eventually landing in Eureka. Although he managed to maintain sobriety briefly upon arriving, Erin soon found himself in the depths of his addiction once again. Enduring homelessness on the streets of Eureka for a short time, he made a decision to seek help at the Eureka Rescue Mission, joining our program on September 21, 2021. Initially unfamiliar with the concept of Jesus being Lord and Savior, Erin's encounter with the truth of the Bible quickly convinced him of its authenticity, prompting him to repent of his sins and embrace Christ as his personal Savior. With this transformation, Erin experienced a radical supernatural spiritual

rebirth which resulted in him flourishing in his knowledge of the Bible and ultimately developing a deep relationship with Jesus. He became a true new creation in Christ. Graduating from the program on September 21, 2022, Erin's dedication and compassion led to his employment as the Men's Shelter contact desk person. He demonstrated remarkable leadership qualities, extending compassion to the homeless guests and always offering assistance in times of need. As time passed, an opportunity arose for Erin to serve as a House Manag-

er, a role that perfectly suited his capabilities. Currently, he continues to excel in his position at the Men's Shelter, while also pursuing personal interests such as learning jujitsu and taking college courses, potentially majoring in Cyber Security. The transformation Erin experienced aligns with the powerful message of 2 Corinthians 5:17: "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new!"

With the indwelling of the Holy Spirit, Eric's inner turmoil rapidly dissipated, paving the way for the beginning of his new adventure with the Lord. So far Eric has made remarkable progress within the program. Born again by the Spirit, by the love and transformative power of Jesus Christ, Eric now expresses a deep gratitude for the opportunity to be a part of the program and the significant impact it has had on his life. Eric continues to be a model program member and continues to grow in his relationship with Christ. Eric said, "I don't know where I would be without the help of the Mission, thank you so much."

Eric Coleman enrolled in the New Life Discipleship Program in February 2023. Prior to joining, Eric
