zation allied with a main body." The earliest entry in a journal for the Eureka Rescue Mission Auxiliary is January 1971. This is approximately 4 years following the establishment of the Eureka Rescue Mission in 1967. Every month there is a 2 hour luncheon meeting which takes place on the 3rd Monday, except for December, and is hosted by different churches of the area. A theme is selected annually, and for this year our theme is "Praise". Our luncheons include a brief Mission report, special music, and a spiritual message based on scripture relating to "Praise." The support we give includes, but is not limited to, prayer for the women and children within the Family Shelter, the men participating in the New Life Program, and the staff at the Eureka Rescue Mission. Other support is provided through our monthly free will offering; The Auxiliary Board will receive word from the Mission of current needs, and from there we can select the items our funds can provide. This becomes the "project" that is presented at the Auxiliary luncheon for approval. Through the years some of

these "projects" have been towards replacing a leaking Family Shelter window, hamburger, appliances, paint for our buildings, and much more. Just this last year the auxiliary raised over \$4,000 to help the Mission. We are so grateful for the guidance God has given us these many years and we praise Him for His unlimited blessings upon the Eureka Rescue Mission. All are welcomed. 

Real Change in 2013

For those who have not taken the opportunity to visit the Mission, or have been blessed not to have been in a situation to need our services, it is hard to express how much is going on at the Shelters. The statistics below are from our Men's Shelter as well as our Women and Children's Shelter for the year of 2013. On any given night, we provide shelter for approximately 94 men, women, and children. We offer many additional services including hot meals served daily, showers, and free clothing from our Shelter locations, as well as free clothing and hygiene items at our Free Store located at our Thrift Store.

Homelessness to Housing

Last year 34 women (along with 18 children) and 92 men went from homelessness to permanent housing by taking advantage of the opportunity of being able to stay at the Shelters for up to 90 days while saving their money in preparation of moving into permanent housing.

New Life Discipleship Program

Upon graduation from our New Life Discipleship Program, men are given a 6 month transition time to live at the Mission to seek employment and save money to move out. We had a total of 8 men graduate in 2013 after

having completed a yearlong commitment on the program. So far, 3 men have found permanent housing, 5 have full time jobs, and 1 is going to the College of the Redwoods full time. We are very proud of each individual who comes to our shelters wanting a change in their life and you play a significant part of that by your support of prayer, time and financial giving.
