







#### **Experience the 2014 Holidays!**

The holiday season is **always** an exciting time here at the Mission, and this past Thanksgiving and Christmas were no exception. There is a lot of activity that keeps everyone busy and on their toes. For our holiday meals, our cook spends the days before the meal preparing the food and the men on the New Life Discipleship Program are busy decorating and preparing the Shelter for the extra activities, a lot like many of us at home prepare for the holidays. The Shelter is here to be a family for those who don't have anyone else, for whatever reason. This past holiday season, with the help of our financial supporters, food donations from local businesses and churches, 96 volunteers from our community served over 600 holiday meals to men, women and children at the Mission. In addition we gave out over 100 food boxes to thankful families in need. The Mission's holiday meal is so much more than filling a physical need. It's an experience of warm smiles and hugs from people who genuinely care about a person's mental, emotional and spiritual need as well as physical. It's a time to leave the worries of the world at the door along with the cold air and warm both body and heart with the fellowship of the folks at the Eureka Rescue Mission. The staff at our Women and Children's Shelter is kept just as busy during the holidays by taking on the task of filling requests for toys from kids in our community. We provide parents with an application that provides us with the sex, age and toys their children requested. This year, we received applications for 287 children in our community! The United Bikers of Northern California brought in a truck load of toys for us that provided the majority of the gifts we needed to fill our toy applications for all the little boys and some of the little girls, but we were still in need of some gifts specifically for girls. Toys for Tots helped us by allowing us to come and pick up some of the girl gifts that were needed. We also had many different individuals call into the Shelter to see what they could do to help out. As we told them we were in need of Christmas gifts for girls, we started receiving toys such as baby dolls, arts and crafts, and princesses. Praise God we were able to fill every application, not just with random toys but toys that the kids asked for on their wish list. In addition, different clubs, churches and individuals took time out of their busy Christmas schedule to join us at the Shelter sharing gifts, treats, and the Love of Christ. The ministry that happens here at the Mission is so much more than a warm bed and a hot meal, it is the culmination of so many individuals' time, prayers, thoughtfulness, and finances that result in hope for so many in our community. # From Hopeless to Hopeful

When opportunities arise for providing people with an alternative to their current situation that is less than optimal, the Eureka Rescue Mission reaches out. Recently, on Friday, January 30, our Executive Director, Bryan Hall Sr., and Family Shelter Director, Lisa Skidmore, visited the occupants at the Blue Heron Lodge on Broadway in Eureka. In light of the closure on February 4th, there were several tenants who were displaced and looking for housing. Along with Adult Services, Eureka Police Department officers, EPD's homeless liaison Pamlyn Millsap, city officials and county workers, Bryan and Lisa were able to screen and evaluate several tenants for services at the Eureka Rescue Mission. Each person was very willing and anxious to hear about the options which were available to them. Other outreach opportunities like this in the past have included reaching out to the people camping behind the Bayshore Mall and Del Norte Street Pier. We have witnessed many people who have come from living in encampments to our shelters, find gainful employment and move into permanent housing. Available and affordable housing for those who are on fixed incomes in our community is hard to find. The Eureka Rescue Mission offers clean and safe, temporary emergency shelter for men,



women and children who find themselves in these life changing circumstances. We are able to give hope in what seem to be hopeless situations. Working together with local service providers has proven to be an effective way to create a plan to meet every need of each person affected. We live in a community filled with people who genuinely care for those less fortunate and together we can continue to make a difference in the lives of many.
